The New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT), committed to developing transportation improvements that best balance transportation needs, improve safety, the environment, community concerns, and cost, will hold a **Public Information Center (PIC)** to inform local residents, public officials and the business community about the **Route 46 and Canfield Avenue (CR 669) Intersection Improvement project located in Mine Hill Township, Morris County.** You are encouraged to actively participate by providing comments at the meeting, by mail, or by e-mail. The Meeting

The Public Information Center will be held at the **Mine Hill Township Municipal Building, 10 Baker Street, Mine Hill NJ 07803, on Tuesday, June 12, 2018, from 5 PM – 8 PM.** Please come at a time that is convenient for you. You will have an opportunity to review exhibits of the proposed project, ask questions and discuss any concerns with NJDOT staff. Property owners of rental units are advised that tenants are also invited and encouraged to participate.

Project Need

The purpose of this project is to improve vehicular and pedestrian mobility at the signalized intersection of Route 46 and Canfield Avenue (CR 669).

The Project

Route 46 will be widened in the vicinity of the intersection to provide an eastbound left turn lane. The existing traffic signal will be replaced as part of the project.

Canfield Avenue (CR 669) will be realigned to improve the turning movements to and from Route 46. New sidewalk will be constructed on the southeast corner of the intersection.

A former mine shaft exists along the south side of Route 46 approximately 300 feet west of the intersection. Settlement of the ground around the mine shaft has occurred and a concrete cap will be placed over the mine shaft as part of this project.

Historic and Cultural Resources

Federal regulations pertaining to the protection of historic properties, referred to as the Section 106 process, require the NJDOT to take into account the effect of proposed projects upon historic resources listed in or eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. A handout with information about the process will be available at the Public Information Center.

NJDOT is required to solicit public input to assist it to carry out the Section 106 process. Historic preservation organizations, historical societies, and similar groups, or individuals with information about cultural resources (archaeological or architectural) in the project area are encouraged to attend the Public Information Center or comments may be submitted to:
